2016 TIMELINE

August 4: Injunction filed by the Standing Rock Sioux, represented by Earthjustice.

August 22: Protestors/Protectors block construction.

September 3: Dakota Access bulldozers through sacred tribal burial ground; Video surfaces of private security attacking Native protesters with dogs and mace.

September 6: US District Judge agrees to temporarily halt construction on a portion of the pipeline.

September 8: ND Governor calls for the North Dakota National Guard to increase law enforcement efforts.

September 9: District Judge denies injunction. Dept. of Justice issues a statement, refusing to authorize construction.

October 9: Still no injunction.

October 10: Dept. of Justice still refuses to authorize construction.

October 13: Journalists charged with trespassing.

SOLIDARITY-BUILDING

- Spread information to bring people in
- Express yourself to build political power
- Contribute material resources, especially labor
- Connect to local organizing
- Reflect on the deeper social issues and your own position in them
- Deepen your connections to your own culture and the Earth

DIRECT ACTION TIPS/STRATEGIES FOR NON-NATIVES

- Behave as an ally
- Understand historical context of the DAPL
- Respect the need for Native autonomy, space, and spirituality
- Follow instructions of the Native leadership
- If you're here to protect the water, you need to be willing to risk lawsuit
- Take supplies for yourself, for fellow travelers, and for the camps

REMOTE SOLIDARITY TIPS

- 1. <u>Divest</u> from your DAPL-supporting banks
- 2. Show material solidarity with the <u>Standing Rock Sioux Nation</u>, <u>Sacred Stone</u>, and the <u>Red Warrior Camp</u>
- 3. Petition your elected officials to bring an end to the entire DAPL
- 4. Become involved in your local #NoDAPL groups and organizations fighting to bring an end to resource extraction.
- 5. Last, but not least, stand as an ally for Indigenous People in all our of our battles.
